



1944 - The Silent Shores Walk



Beginning beside the historic shores of Slapton Sands, this peaceful coastal walk follows one of Devon's most unique landscapes, where the sea rolls endlessly along one side of the path while the calm freshwater waters of Slapton Ley, rich with wildlife and quiet reflections, rest silently on the other beneath wide skies and drifting sea mist.

Slapton Sands

A dramatic stretch of coastline where sea views and open skies feel endlessly expansive.



Slapton Ley

A rare freshwater lake rich with wildlife, peaceful reeds, and calm reflective waters.

A quiet reminder of Exercise Tiger and the soldiers who trained here before D-Day in 1944.



Torcross Village

A peaceful coastal village with sea air, cafés, and sweeping views across Start Bay.
